# GATEWAY PARK OVERVIEW



Hancock Health has been managing the needs of Hancock County since 1951. In that time, we have served as a trusted healthcare partner and grown with the community. We have become the greatest economic engine of the county, employing over 1000 people. In 2019 we began to look at our next step in growth, knowing that population trends will force a need for a second hospital in Hancock County in the coming decades. The purchase of 140 acres of land and construction of the Gateway Hancock urgent care, imaging center and lab was a strategic investment to put us in the most growth-oriented part of the county.

Situated just south of the intersection of I-70 and Mt. Comfort Road, Hancock Health sees Gateway as a connector between our location in McCordsville and our world class medical wellness center in New Palestine. The first phase of the campus has begun and is intended to lay the foundation for expansion of Hancock Health, further serving the immediate and future healthcare needs of Hancock County. The campus will utilize 25 acres for hospital and medical services, including diagnostic imaging, laboratory services, outpatient services, surgery services, immediate care and more. The remainder of the property, 115 acres, is open for development that we think will be complementary to our investment. We hope to surround our services with a variety of commercial uses including: Hotel with conference center; Restaurant; Office (HQ): Aging in Place facility; Research & Development; Advanced Manufacturing; retail and more. We are looking for partners who want to be a part of the growth of Hancock County.

Hancock County is a rapidly growing county that is just East of Indianapolis. The Mount Comfort Corridor runs North and South through the county, collecting commuters from McCordsville and Hamilton County to the North and New Palestine to the South. Gateway is 3 miles South of Indianapolis Regional Airport, and 15 minutes or less from Cumberland, New Palestine, Greenfield, McCordsville, Lawrence, Irvington, and the east side of Indianapolis.





















### GATEWAY PARK

#### ZONING

In 2019 we put into place a Planned Unit Development (PUD) document that described the permitted uses by zoning. Refer to the detailed Land Use Matrix. The development standards have been designed to build and protect the considerable investment into the medical campus, but also to create an environment that sets the stage for the expansive growth that is happening in Hancock County, including development at Indianapolis Regional Airport along with the protection of natural resources. We are happy to explore uses not included in the PUD that meet our overall vision.



## MOUNT COMFORT ROAD CORRIDOR

Running from I-69 to I-74, we see the Mount Comfort Road Corridor as the thoroughfare of the future. Hancock Health strategically chose the Gateway site to place themselves in the epicenter of future development. Currently the corridor is seeing over one billion dollars in new investment, with 11+ new buildings and thousands of net new jobs coming online. The I-70 interchange is an ideal location to establish key amenities to serve the corridor. These amenities should include at least a hotel with meeting rooms, a small conference center, or both; quality restaurant options; and other business services, such as computing, accounting, and software consulting, to serve businesses and business travelers. Hancock Gateway Park on the southwest corner of the interchange provides a perfect opportunity for these types of uses.

The I-70 interchange at Mount Comfort Road is one of the key economic development assets along the corridor. It is the commercial and industrial gateway to the corridor. To fully leverage this asset, Hancock Health and other local stakeholders are coming together to affect more strategic growth. The corridor plan will focus on:

- Expedite and complete road and infrastructure improvements north and south of the interchange. Much of the work north of the interchange is already funded and scheduled for implementation.
- Install gateway signage and other welcoming improvements at the interchange so that visitors and others know they have arrived at the Mount Comfort Corridor. This will help establish the Mount Comfort Corridor brand at this important entrance to the corridor.
- Establish zoning and design standards that will ensure a consistent and attractive environment on both sides of the interchange to create higher-quality address for future businesses.


Less than three miles North is the Indianapolis Regional Airport, as well as a concentration of logistics-oriented development North of I-70 that is booming.



## HEALTHWAY PARK / NEW PALESTINE

Hancock Health has made an additional investment into property in New Palestine, culminating in a world-class medical wellness center at "Healthway Park". The intent for this property is to offer residents and visitors to New Palestine a mixed-use development containing land uses that complement our medical and life wellness center currently under construction. In order to achieve this goal Hancock Health has created a Planned Unit Development that raises the bar for development in the community, establishes architectural landscaping requirements that will enhance the area. We will require high standards for building materials and site design, multipurpose trail plans and other general site amenities.

When creating the park's PUD we prioritized development that will promote a healthy lifestyle. Being mindful that the property abuts two gateways to the Town, US Highway 52 and Mt Comfort Road, we also want to be intentional with the development that occurs here.




